INTRO & RECAP

Hello Partners! Welcome back to the [Night Owl](#) 🦉, your nightly recap of need-to-know information and intel on what's happening under the Gold Dome.

Today marked the opening day of the 2026 Legislative Session, and it opened with a clear message. ACLU and Indivisible's "Pack the Capitol" Day brought a strong showing of Georgians to the Gold Dome in support of protecting civil liberties. The turnout reinforced what we continue to hear across the state: Georgians expect their rights to be defended and their voices to matter.

As the session gets underway, several issues are already emerging as ones to watch. Early conversations point to potential changes to property taxes, renewed proposals to eliminate Georgia's state income tax by 2032, a possible expansion of last year's K–8 cellphone ban to include high school classrooms, and proposed adjustments to SNAP funding.

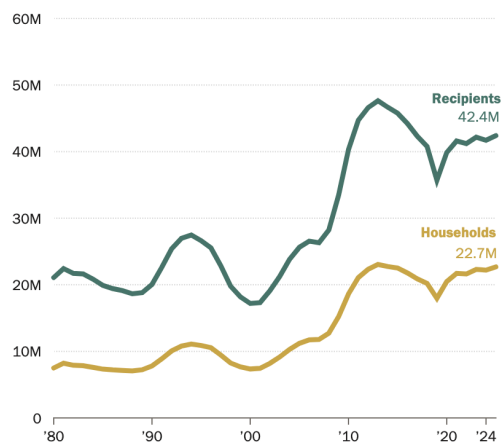
