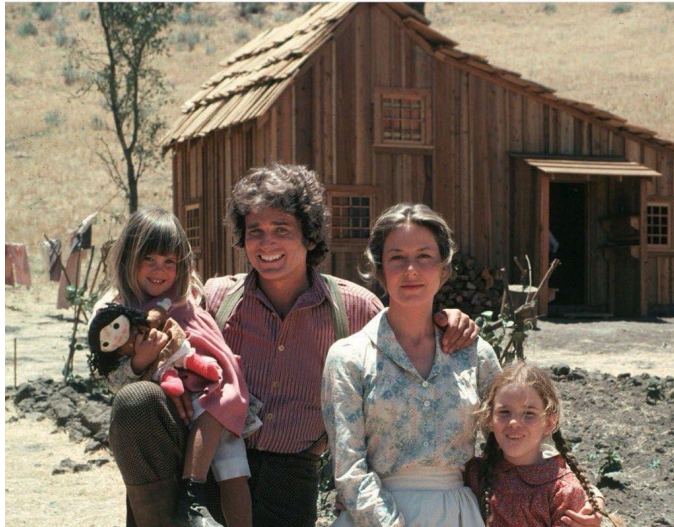

Today under the Gold Dome, Governor Brian Kemp delivered his final State of the State address filled with confident claims about Georgia's finances and economic strength. Record reserves, accelerated tax cuts, and another proposed one-time rebate took center stage. But for many Georgians, the gap between those numbers and daily life remains wide.

While families continue to face rising housing costs, health care pressures, and uneven access to opportunity, the administration's vision rests on limiting government growth rather than expanding long-term solutions.

As the legislative session moves forward, the central question is not whether Georgia has the resources to meet this moment. It is whether those resources will be used to stabilize lives, strengthen communities, and make affordability more than a talking point.



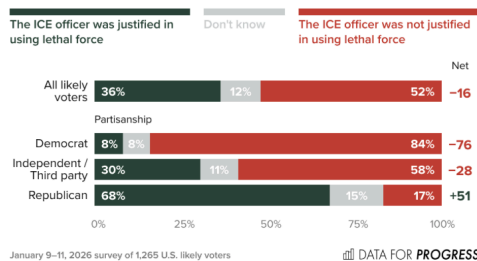

Voters Do Not Believe the ICE Officer in Minneapolis Was Justified in Using Lethal Force

Based on what you have seen or heard, do you believe the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officer who shot and killed a woman in Minneapolis was justified in using lethal force?



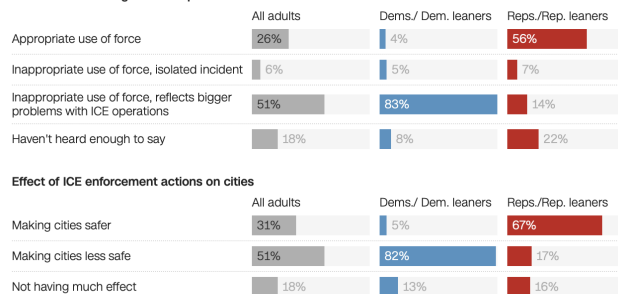
A Majority of Voters Say ICE's Use of Lethal Force in Minneapolis Was Not Justified

New polling from Data for Progress finds that most voters disagree with the Trump administration's version of events and say that the ICE officer was not justified in using lethal force.

Only 8% of likely voters say they have heard "nothing at all" about the ICE shooting, while 63% say they have heard "a lot" and 29% say they have heard "a little." Additionally, we find that 50% of voters have an unfavorable opinion of ICE, while 46% have a favorable view of the agency.

Note: The CNN poll was conducted by SSRS from January 9-12 among a random national sample of 1,209 US adults drawn from a probability-based panel. Surveys were either conducted online or by telephone with a live interviewer. Results shown in this chart have a margin of sampling error of up to ±4.9 percentage points. Some results may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Most Americans call shooting by ICE agent in Minneapolis an inappropriate use of force

Most Americans see an immigration officer's fatal shooting of Minneapolis resident Renee Good as an inappropriate use of force, a new CNN poll conducted by SSRS finds. Roughly half view it as a sign of broader issues with the way US Immigration and Customs Enforcement is operating, with less than one-third saying that ICE operations have made cities safer.

Majority Of Voters Think Fatal Shooting Of Minneapolis Woman By ICE Agent Was Not Justified

Days after an Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agent fatally shot a Minneapolis woman in an incident that was captured on video, voters 82 - 18 percent say they have seen a video of the shooting and a majority (53 percent) think the shooting was not justified, 35 percent think it was justified, and 12 percent did not offer an opinion, according to a Quinipiac (KWIN-uh-pea-ack) University national poll of registered voters released today.

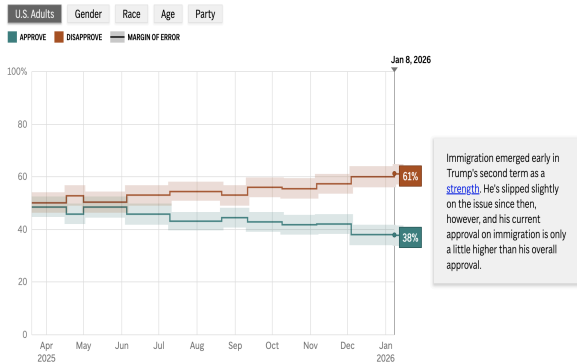
